

The workshop fosters a culture of continuous improvement, enriching student engagement and promoting deeper understanding in Islamic schools. Its contributions lie in cultivating reflective practitioners poised to nurture holistic learning experiences grounded in Islamic values.

• (2C II) This presentation illustrates applying the experiential learning cycle (ELC) in physical education (PE). The ELC's four phases—Experience/Activity, Reflecting, Generalizing and Abstracting, and Transfer—are discussed. In PE, daily activities provide students with initial learning experiences in sports. After each activity, students reflect on what worked and seek solutions for unsuccessful attempts. They then generalize their findings to create a plan for future success, leading to a

deeper understanding of skill competency and enjoyment in sports.

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
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


